Tok/Wasilla Lake

The Tok Wolverines swept the Wasilla Lake Rams Saturday, as the girls cruised to a 46-36 win and the boys won their 49-46 game in exciting fashion.

Desiree Demit and Tori Cronk led the Wolverines with 17 and 14 points, respectively, while Mindy Gonzales' 14 points and Darla Soulak's 12 points were team-highs for the Rams.

The Tok boys survived a late-game scare to secure their win. The Wolverines held a 32-15 halftime lead and were ahead 45-27 heading into the fourth quarter.

The Wolverines' top two scorers, Darren Couch, who finished with 17 points and Allan Brooks, who finished with 15 points, fouled out at the start of the fourth quarter, leaving only four Tok players on the floor to finish the game.

The Rams took advantage of the undermanned Wolverines and closed to within one point in the final minute of the game. Devin Warren, who put up 13 points for Tok, was fouled and hit a pair of free throws to secure the win and keep the Wolverines undefeated.

Friday, the Tok girls beat the Effie Kokrine girls 62-51.

Tok was led by Cronk and Demit, who scored 19 points apiece, and Tre'Ann Ewan, who finished the game with 16 points.

The Warriors were led by Elizabeth Jerue's 17 points, while Shannon Hosken and Justin Kokrine finished with 13 and 10, respectively.
